As a learner at Driffield School and Sixth Form you are entitled to a wide range of support with Careers Education, Information, Advice and Guidance. It is an important part of the curriculum and it is of the utmost importance that all young people should be encouraged and supported to move towards a working life, which is right for them; will be enjoyable as well as provide economic well being. Mrs Mortimer is passionate that all students' receive excellent support during lockdown; therefore the provision has been changed to virtual CEIAG.

In moving from adolescence to adulthood, all young people will need to develop:

- An awareness of all the possible opportunities open to them at the age of 16 and the age of 18 that are likely to suit their individual skills and attributes as they move into and through their working lives
- The skills of decision-making and action planning
- Positive attitudes towards themselves and others; self-reliance and taking responsibility for the outcomes of decisions they make

As a learner at Driffield School and Sixth Form you can access the following during the Covid 19 pandemic to support your career pathway:

- Access to the START Profile to support your virtual careers learning
- Access to Shape Your Future in the Humber – a guide to labour market information in the Humber, so students are aware of the local opportunities and future opportunities.
- Access to Log On Move On for Year 10 students, including their own personal username and password to support their transition, to ensure they can complete their Employability Passport, virtual work experience and to help build their CV using the CV writer.
- Access to the STEP UP careers learning range for Key Stage 3 to help develop their CEIAG awareness and knowledge.
- Access to LMI Information and monthly updates from LMI Humber. This includes work linked to the dedicated LMI sectors.
- Access to the transition work for Year 11, 12, 13 and 14 students. This includes the fantastic Eton College courses – Writing Skill and Making an Impact
- Access to virtual work experience and virtual talks from Speakers for Schools and SpringPod.
- Regular email updates for Year 9 to Year 14 students to ensure students access important events such as the largest university virtual careers fair, FE and HE information and transition details.
- Access to one-to-one telephone careers appointment with Mrs Barker, our Level 6 Careers Adviser.
